

"A Future with Hope Mission Fund Campaign" is a 3-year conference-wide effort to raise more than \$12 million for local church mission, Imagine No Malaria, and Sandy Relief. People need us more than ever right now:

- 650,000 people will die of malaria this year alone; every \$10 saves a life!
- more than 22,000 of our neighbors are still displaced from their homes nearly a year after the storm; our combined efforts will enable 500 families to have their homes repaired and get their lives "back to normal"; and;
- our local community has needs that only we can fill: 25% of every dollar we raise will be go to the great work of "SHIP" (Summit Helping Its People)

Our Outreach Committee has dedicated 1/3 of its annual budget for each of the next three years toward this combined effort! Additionally, plans are being made to hold an "Our Christmas for Others" event in December to augment our support. Keep on the alert for ways to be involved!

In this conversation we discussed the meaning and purpose of why we offer Christian education. 




