AT OUR FEET

A few months back, we completed a ten-week study on the book of Genesis. Within those weeks, we enjoyed conversations about our perspectives on the biblical characters, our opinions about a God who would roll out a sacred story in the odd fashion that Genesis portrays, our humorous (or frustrated) impressions of the journey of faith, and so much more.

And, week after week, there were children at our feet as we read and spoke and prayed. Several of the participants brought their children, aged 6 months to 4 years, and they became a beloved part of our class.

As we studied and learned, they listened and played quietly with a small basket of toys on the floor. They witnessed our freedom with questions, they were present as we had "aha!" moments, and they observed how we wrestled with our readings.

While I doubt that the toddlers grasped the impact of the Hagar-Sarah struggle, and I suspect they were not at all impressed by the details of Jacob's conniving ways, still, I am very very sure that *they* were learning, as *we* were learning.

They were learning that it is important to keep learning even when one is an adult.

They were learning what open dialogue sounds like.

They were learning that the community of faith is made up of people with widely varied circumstances and stories, all coming together because of something beyond us.

They were learning about commitment to faith and to each other.




