FASTING: A Means of Grace

"Blow the trumpet in Zion; sanctify a fast; call a solemn assembly; gather the people." Joel 2:15-16

This year, our Lenten worship gatherings will focus on the spiritual discipline of *fasting*.

A **fast** is a commitment to *do without*, as an intentional avenue of spiritual growth. A fast is an act of personal discipline, an invitation for God to bring new insight, and a reminder of our ultimate dependence upon the Lord.

On Sunday mornings, we will examine the nature and gift of fasting, and on Wednesday evenings we will consider different specific kinds of fasts (such as fasting from technology, from complaint, from hurry...)

Some people fast from **food**, from **television**, from **talking**, from **social media**, from **coffee**, from **driving**, from **complaining**... What might it mean to fast from **email** for a day each week, or to eliminate all **'background noise'** for a day?

As you examine your life, what form of fast speaks to you?

LENTEN SOUP SUPPERS

WEDNESDAYS IN LENT

(March 12th through April 9th, in the Social Hall)

6:30 Soup Supper (Social Hall) (The soup supper begins 30 minutes after the close of 'Wow! It's Wednesday' activities)

7:00 Worship in the Chapel

Each Wednesday evening you are invited to gather **at 6:30 in the Social Hall for a soup supper** (*note the new time*.)

With the help of volunteer "Soup Chefs" we will share in a simple meal as we walk through Lent:

If you are willing to provide a simple soup supper on one of the Wednesday nights, please add your name to the sign-up sheet in the Social Hall so we can plan appropriately. Please anticipate at least 20 attendees. (Please consider making vegetarian options for those who cannot eat meat.)

This is a casual, gentle way to mark the weeks of self-reflection, recognizing that we do so as a community.

Following the supper, at 7:00 pm we will gather in the Chapel for a brief service of worship (concluding around 7:30 pm), which will usually include Holy Communion.

ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING

On March 2, 2014 we will receive a special offering in worship for "One Great Hour of Sharing."

The funds will go to the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR). Your gifts do remarkable things: feed people with food and hope, wrap babies in warmth and love, empower communities with skills and support. Gifts renew the giver, too, in spirit and in strength.



Our support of UMCOR enables the Church to respond immediately in times of critical need. With this offering, the United Methodist Church rebuilds lives and communities around the world by helping the United Methodist Committee on Relief keep its promise that 100% of your designated gift goes to specific causes. While other groups come in immediately and then leave, "UMCOR is there for the long term and does a tremendous amount of work over a long period of time."

On Wednesday, March 5, 2014, all are invited to begin the Lenten journey toward Easter by gathering for an ASH WEDNESDAY service of worship, 7:00 p.m. in the Chapel.

We call this day Ash Wednesday because ashes have been used for centuries as a sign of remorse and repentance. Ancient Jews used to dress in sackcloth and place ashes upon their foreheads as a sign of anguish and penitence.

The Christian church took on the tradition of taking the palms of the previous year's Palm Sunday and burning them to ashes, and then on Ash Wednesday, making the sign of the cross with the ashes on the forehead on this day that starts Lent. This ritual signifies the sorrow of believers as they meditate on the sacrifice that Christ made for our sake and made efforts to deepen their commitment to discipleship.

In addition to offering the imposition of ashes, the worship service on Ash Wednesday will include the Lord's Supper. *A Lenten daily devotional guide will be distributed at the Ash Wednesday service.*


Join us March 12th for a Lenten worship service. Each year during Lent our church gathers for soup suppers and worship, and each year the youth of our church help to lead one of these worship services.


• A two page essay highlighting your community, church and school involvement. Please also explain your economic need.





IHN NEWS



Our Family Promise Union County Interfaith Hospitality Network (IHN) guests (up to 14 individuals in as many as four families) will be with us from March 2-9 and again from March 30-April 6. When we host in our church

we have a great deal of support from Family Promise and the local Summit community. The quests arrive on Sunday and find that their rooms on the third floor have been prepared with warm beds, towels, laundry baskets, drying racks and toiletry bags, all set up by the youth during their lockdown (or Sunday School time). Sometime during the evening the Summit Fire Department arrives and conducts a fire drill so that all the guests are prepared in case of an emergency. They usually bring a fire engine and let the kids explore, which they love. Early in the morning a hot breakfast is delivered by SHIP (Summit Helping Its People) from Calvary Episcopal Church where about 30 men and women are fed and receive bag lunches every weekday.

On Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday, our friends from St. Teresa's RC Church provide dinner and overnight coverage. We owe them and their coordinator, Mary Kate Pach, our heartfelt thanks. They are true partners in this mission and just love our kitchen! The guests are picked up in the morning and ride to Elizabeth in the Family Promise van driven by Leon, our new friend. The Day Center in Elizabeth provides a base from which the guests go to work or school, do job searches, learn skills and have laundry and shower facilities for their use.

Being homeless is never a good situation and it takes many people, staff and volunteers, to help the families feel that they are not alone. If you would like to know more about how you can become a more active member of the support team, see Ann Houpt.

SUMMIT, N.J., Feb. 20, 2014 - **The City of Summit Office of Emergency Management Police and Fire Departments** are establishing a Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) and recruiting volunteer participants for the eight-week training program on Monday evenings in March and April.

The goal of **CERT training** is to educate volunteers about disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact the Summit area and train them in *basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations*. Using the skills learned in classroom sessions and during exercises, Summit CERT members will take an active role in disaster preparedness projects and in assisting professional emergency responders. CERT members will also help with non-emergency projects to improve community safety.

"Our goal in establishing this program is for CERT members and response personnel to work together for the benefit of the community," explains Summit Police Chief Robert Weck. "CERT training will give people the decision-making, organizational, and practical skills needed to effectively assist in emergency situations."

CERT training *is free* and open to all Summit residents age 16 and older. The **20***hours of training* are classroom based with few physical requirements. In the CERT training, citizens will learn to:

- Manage utilities and put out small fires
- Treat for shock and control bleeding
- Provide basic medical aid
- Search for and rescue victims safely
- Organize themselves and spontaneous volunteers to be effective
- Collect disaster intelligence to support first responder efforts

According to Police Lt. Michael Cantone, who is coordinating the CERT effort for the City of Summit, CERT teams have been established in other towns throughout New Jersey and the nation "to provide ongoing disaster preparedness and emergency support." Cantone describes CERT as "a positive and realistic approach to emergency and disaster situations where citizens may initially be on their own and their actions can make a difference."


