

Our Knitting/Crocheting ministry has created countless squares that are just waiting for someone to knit, sew or crochet them together, turning squares into blankets!





Our Hand Bell Choir rehearses *Sunday mornings at 9:00am* in the Sanctuary. Come and ring with us.


Chancel Choir

In observance of Lent, we will abstain from using disposable plates, cups, and flatware. Instead we will use reusable ceramic coffee mugs and dishware from the kitchen during coffee hour throughout the weeks of Lent.

This benefits the church in three ways:

First: this change will reduce the amount of waste associated with the coffee hour Second: this change reduces the cost associated with coffee hour.

Third: this change will help us to experience one form of sacrifice during Lent.
