We invite all people to participate in our community and worship life, without insisting that they become like us in order to be acceptable, including but not limited to:

- *those who hope for a better world and those who have lost hope
- *believers and seekers
- *conventional Christians and questioning skeptics
- *women, men, children, and youth
- *those of all sexual orientations and gender identities
- *those of all races and cultures
- *those of all income levels
- *those of all classes and abilities

The statement was originally created by the Greater New Jersey Conference in 2005, and we here at UMC of Summit celebrate how well it states the invitation we seek to offer—the invitation we seek to *embody*—in our life together.

We believe that this statement expresses our desire to live fully into the "Open Hearts, Open Minds, Open Doors" slogan of our denomination, and it expresses the kind of grace-full invitation that our Savior offers to all.

Together we celebrate God's work in the lives of our young disciples. They have faithfully journeyed through class lessons, worship, homework, discussions, and reflection.

They have benefitted from the care and support of their families and friends who have journeyed with them in this process of spiritual growth, and they have developed individual **statements of faith** in response to the curriculum topics.

Spiritual growth is a life-long journey, and confirmation is one vital season in this journey. Learning about the scriptures, discovering about how God is at work in the world, finding insights about the meaning of discipleship continue throughout *every* age and stage of a Christian's life.

As you review the past 2-5 years of your life, what insights has it held? With what faith questions do you wrestle? How has your prayer life evolved? In what ways do you find your abilities being used on behalf of the Gospel? As disciples, we are each called to a lifelong, living relationship with God. Below you will find the framework each student has used to create their statements of faith, which are posted on the wall in the Social Hall. How would you respond to these questions?

As our young people engage this season of spiritual growth, let us follow their lead and review our season of faith as well.

What are two of your favorite images of God and why they are your favorites?

What have you discovered about God in the past year?

How would you describe Jesus to a 4 year old?

Name one gift God has given you and how you might use it for God.

Name one person you know personally (perhaps someone in the church) who is helping God to

make the world a better place. What is it that this person is doing?

Name your most favorite worship service this year (and why).

Name your least favorite worship service this year (and why).

Tell your favorite Bible story and why it is your favorite.

When and where do you find it best to pray, and why?

What does Holy Communion mean to you?

What does Baptism mean to you?

What do you think God is doing during communion?

What do you think God is doing in a Baptism?


This Just In....Mission Minutes!

SHIP – (SUMMIT HELPING ITS PEOPLE)



SHIP was established more than twenty years ago by the Summit Interfaith Clergy in response to the population of mostly men who were homeless or at risk of homelessness in our community.

The all-volunteer organization has as its mission feeding and providing access to social services for those in need. The programs are administered by a Board of Directors made up of members of Summit congregations. For many years Bill Houpt served on the board and was the chair for two terms. Our church does not currently have a representative on the SHIP board - anyone who is interested should see Bill for details.

The **feeding programs** have two components. On weekday mornings between 6:00 and 7:30 am, volunteers cook breakfast and prepare bag lunches for about 25 patrons at Calvary Episcopal Church. When the IHN guests are in a Summit congregation, the cook prepares a hot breakfast which is delivered to the hosting congregation. On Saturday and Sunday afternoons a full dinner is prepared by volunteers and served at the Oakes Center for about 15 to 20 guests. Both programs allow time for participants to socialize, bathrooms are available and at Oakes there is a television for entertainment.

When **the shower** was installed in our church to accommodate our IHN guests it was also made available to SHIP patrons twice a week. This program is supervised by Bill Houpt and Ken Clark and male *volunteers are needed* for this program also.


