FROM THE PASTOR

On October 24, 2015, we held our annual church conference, at which officers are elected and we reflect upon our ministry. I offer you here my report:

In its regular pattern of our congregational life, there is always much reason for joy.

For example, a community garden was added to our lawn in the hopes that, as folks engage in our summer Chalkboard Conversations, they would also avail themselves of the produce growing nearby. Several small groups continue to faithfully meet for mutual learning and spiritual support; and the overall community has maintained its growing interest in adult study. In the past twelve months studies have been offered on the prophet Isaiah, the Minor Prophets, the books "What's So Amazing About Grace" and "Being Mortal," studies on the environment from a faith perspective, and African-American spirituals. Intergenerational learning experiences have also provided creative opportunities for expanding the steadfast Sunday School ministry.

Furthermore, opportunities for quiet reflection continue to multiply. The annual enthusiasm for Lenten mid-week services has taught us that there is an eagerness for spaces for meditation; we have begun monthly Taize prayer services, and are exploring alternative avenues for learning and worship.

This year, as we joined the community GreenFaith initiative, we have endeavored to enlighten our community through education and service opportunities, including "ride a bike to church" Sundays, paperless Coffee Hours, video series, and invitations to regional events.

The mission work of the church continues to be strong, as hospitality is offered to Family Promise guests four weeks each year, Sandy victims receive relief through A Future With Hope efforts, monthly food drives for the CAUSE pantry in Jersey City continue, a team spent a day at CUMAC assisting in its ministry, and persons in need receive knitted/crocheted items made with prayer and love.

This has been a full year for our church.

In addition to the normal activities of church life, we engaged Connie Merchant, a congregational consultant, to assist us in establishing a clearer and more focused vision for our life in this season. The fruit of that work was a greater understanding of our church identity, which can serve to guide us in making more grounded and informed plans as we let go of who we once were or who we wish we were, and lay claim to who we are as the body of Christ. We can more readily acknowledge our strengths and weaknesses, letting go of the temptation to mimic what might work in other communities and instead faithfully live into who we are.

We have determined that, as a congregation, we are much like a person in the sandwich generation: busy with multiple responsibilities, limited in resources, gifted with compassion and generosity, and hungering to participate in offering renewal to others in similar circumstances.

In light of this identity, we now move forward to act on four areas of focus: our strengths, our obstacles, ministry beyond ourselves, and our future. As of this writing we are establishing teams for each of these areas, as action plans are created.

The fruitfulness of these endeavors will depend upon the commitment of the congregation. This is a season in which all hands are needed as we take hold of new direction and deepened insight into who we are as God's people in this time and place.

May God bless us as we move forward into this year with a renewed sense of vision and commitment.

On the First Sunday of each month, we invite you to bring nonperishable food items to worship, that we might feed others!

Your donations are then brought to CAUSE, a food pantry in Jersey City.

Why is this one of our ministries? Here is the history of CAUSE:

About 35 years ago there were five Methodist churches in Jersey City. All of them were having financial problems. They wanted to help the many homeless people and others who were living at a very low income level in Jersey City.

Members of the five churches met with officials of the NJ Annual Conference to decide what to do. They decided to ask the suburban Methodist churches for help. They formed an organization called CAUSE (Christian Approach to Urban Suburban Encounter). One of the primary purposes of this organization was to get suburban churches involved in helping the poor in Jersey City. CAUSE is a program of the Greater New Jersey Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church which contributes a large part of their annual budget.

About 25 years ago, CAUSE purchased a building in Jersey City on Bergen Avenue. This building houses the CAUSE shop and has four tenants. The CAUSE shop is divided into two areas, each with its own access to the street. In one area, clothes and small household items are sold for very low prices. These items are almost all from donations by churches and individuals. The other half of the shop is devoted to giving food to needy people. Some of the food is donated by our church and other churches, but most of it is purchased from the Food Bank in Elizabeth. In order to receive food from CAUSE, the recipients must show a letter from an agency such as the Red Cross.

When CAUSE was first established, members of the suburban churches went to Jersey City to work in the shop. Anna Clark and Sarah Epperly from our church went in at least once a week. Some years ago the Epperly's moved away. Anna became the Treasurer, a position she held for 17 years. Gradually, fewer suburbanites participated but people from the Jersey City Methodist churches took up the slack. After Anna's death, Ken Clark was asked to serve on the board. He is now the only board member from a suburban church. The other board members are all from Jersey City Methodist churches, except for a pastor who represents the Conference. The board presently has ten members.

CAUSE now has only two permanent employees. One is the Director who also runs the food pantry. The other is the woman who runs the thrift shop. Both live in Jersey City. Local people work in the shop, help unload the food, drive the van and do other temporary jobs. Some are volunteers. Some receive small payments.

CAUSE is a vital ministry of care for those in great need. If you wish to contribute, you can bring bags of non-perishable food to the church on the first Sunday of each month, or you can leave bags in the kitchen at any time.

Christian Education

At a "Wow It's Wednesday last month," we discussed God choosing David because of what was in his heart. "What do you want God to see in your heart?, I asked. Responses included, "Kindness, love, thankfulness, hope, and joy." What I loved even more than the responses was asking the question together. Children and adults were both journeying in faith together, learning with and from each other. At our equine experience, we wondered together about how to create a safe space to be with God. How are you learning from and with our children? How



might the questions we have be just as important as the responses? Join us this month. All are welcome!
