Reflections from Pastor Shawn Callender Hogan

Below please find my Annual Report, which will be offered at the Church Conference

The year 2017 marks 150 years of Methodist ministry in Summit. And as we spend this year celebrating our heritage, we have joyfully welcomed former pastors to the pulpit, thus far including Bruce Barrabee, Rich Hendrickson, Gina Hendrickson, and have

received messages of love from Dean Lanning and Clark Callender. We look forward to welcoming other pastors in the months to come. We have honored those who have been members for many years, lifted up those who have been baptized here and rejoiced with those who were married here. September 17th marked the celebratory Sunday brunch at the Grand Summit Hotel, complete with video and photo displays, and words of greeting from Summit's Mayor Nora Radest.

This year we also welcomed Roy Christensen, property manager, and Rosa Marguinhos, custodian, to our church staff, as they join Sherri Shumate, JoAnne Teubner Prussak, and Polly Del Campo in offering exceptional oversight to our shared work. Under the care of this fine team, the church facility and ministries are cared for with skill, compassion, and vision.

Sherri, JoAnne, Polly, Roy, and Rosa each enable us to be a place where God's love takes concrete form.

Our Christian Education ministry provides superior care for disciples of all ages through Sunday morning, Sunday afternoon, and Wednesday afternoon programs. Whether it be through biblically-based curriculum, mindful play, or service-oriented activities, the faith community is offered avenues for strengthened scriptural knowledge, deepened spiritual awareness, and broadened care for others.

We continue to make every effort to respond to the fluctuating schedules of our community, which place particular strain on the availability of our members to be consistent participants in the programs offered here. We are aware that this is just one of many signs of the changed and changing culture, and individuals and households will need to work with the church in new ways if the church is to provide support in spiritual formation.

We experience the same dynamic in our worship life, as we struggle to increase our Sunday worship attendance. The monthly prayer service provides an additional mid-week opportunity for reflection and soul-tending. We continue, somewhat slowly, to build on the idea of offering a monthly service for persons in recovery and their loved ones, or for whomever the 12-step program has been helpful. This dream is slowly coming to life as we carefully gain vital input and guidance from the recovery community.

Whether on Sunday morning, monthly prayer services, or mid-week seasonal services, our music ministry provides a strong foundation for enriched worship experiences. From our five choirs to our instrumentalists and soloists, our music ministry provides joyful and varied offerings for praising God. The gifts of our diverse community are encouraged and celebrated every time we gather.

While there are many ministries that continue across the years, this year we earned a "Summit Green Star," a community award for being an organization that is attentive to environmental concerns. We also initiated a monthly Open Mic Night for the surrounding community, in an effort to provide a safe and nurturing space for young people to use their talents and their voices. We have found the event to be a source of value for all ages, and we look forward to a second successful year. This new ministry is supported by the steadfast efforts of a team of members who, without fail, provide the creative and diligent attention needed.

The same kind of dedication is evidenced in our many outreach ministries, as throughout this celebration year we have continued to live into our rich heritage of care for those in need, hosting the SHIP breakfast program, providing meals for Jefferson School families, and continuing the annual "Our Christmas For Others" fundraiser. In Lent we took a creative path for gathering needed items for CUMAC, as each week we collected a food item highlighted in the morning scripture story. We volunteered at CUMAC and did a Bridges run, baked bread and cooked soup together for our Family Promise families, and knitted countless blankets for patients of Overlook Hospital. These ministries are strong because of the persistent devotion and enthusiasm of our church community.

Eighteen months ago we identified a call to be a place that provides renewal for the surrounding community amid the stresses of our time. That sense of identity gave birth to monthly coloring events, quarterly nature walks, yoga for children, "zentangle" and horticultural meditation events, and a month of mind/body/spirit gatherings. In January I took a one-month renewal leave, to be re-centered in God's claim upon my life, and the congregation joined me from afar, in prayer and in spirit. Together we daily lit candles, as we lifted each other up on the spiritual journey. Twice since then we have offered the larger community a five-day prayer experience: an early morning conference call during which we pray the Examen. Those who have participated found it to be an important way to begin their day. I have enrolled in a certification program for Spiritual Direction, and trust that those skills will enrich and empower the congregation's attention to the divine in our midst.

The spiritual health of the church will be its most vital resource in addressing the unexpected closure of our Preschool this spring. Over recent years, the Wesley Preschool enrollment had been decreasing, a sign of the changing needs of the families in our area. This year our enrollment dipped below that which is needed to sustain the program, and so we will not be offering classes in the coming year. On June 11th we gave God thanks for the tremendous blessings that have been a part of the preschool ministry, and celebrated its teachers and the many families it touched across its 47 years.

Since the closure of the Preschool, we have entered into an intentional process of dreaming about and discerning the next uses for the classroom space and new ministries for our time. Dreaming is a joy-filled endeavor, and discernment requires openness to God's leading. Both tasks are exciting, intriguing, and require a degree of trust. Yet, I believe that the most challenging stage will come when a path is clear and the work of fully living into the new ministry begins. Any fruitful avenue forward requires the heartfelt engagement of the whole community, moving past general affirmation and into true ownership, in which everyone has "skin in the game." This next step in the process will call upon our collective commitment in ways we have yet to discover. We will need God's encouragement as a new season unfolds.

Thankfully, we have a long history when it comes to leaning on God for strength and direction. Our history as a local church began with a handful of Methodists identifying and responding with collective vigor to a need. This heritage will serve us well in the days that lie ahead.

"Loaves and Fishes" is a vital ministry of care for those in great need and is located at St. Teresa's Roman Catholic Church, Summit, NJ.


