From the Pastor



My cat's name is Atticus.

I come from a family that generally chooses (what I think are) interesting names for pets. We had one cat in my childhood who was named Scheherezade; my brother's cats are Holmes and Watson... You get the picture. And so, Atticus: a strong, interesting name, from a powerful movie. A name that depicts wisdom and justice.

A cool name.

But now the novel "Go, Set a Watchman" has been released. And it has rattled the legacy of this wonderful name. Now, 'Atticus' is a name that also depicts the pervasiveness of racism and the innocence of childhood idealism. 'Atticus' is now problematic. And this makes me uncomfortable.

But as uncomfortable as this makes me feel, it is important for me to be uncomfortable.

It is important, so that I do not risk evading, denying, or ignoring the very real and very harsh reality of racism in our time. It is important, because it reminds me that there is an undeniable tension between how I wish the world were, and how the world truly is. It is important, because there is also an undeniable tension between the way I want to believe I live and my own unwitting complicity with racism as it continues in our society. I believe we must stay painfully open to discovering where and how we ourselves are partners with racism.

And it is also important, because discomfort prompts work that makes way for new possibilities.

You may recall that the Summit community developed "dialogue circles" this spring, for the purpose of interracial conversation specifically on the issue of race. On the last gathering of the dialogue circle in which I participated, we were each asked to offer one word for how we were feeling. The words varied greatly, as you can imagine.

The word I shared was "hope." For as difficult as this road is, as I could see the power of conversation and story. I could see the impact of painful honesty. I could see the difference that naming difficult truths makes in our shared life. And for that reason, my word was 'hope.'

We won't be changing the name of our cat. He remains Atticus. He is still beloved. And, in his name, he bears witness to the deep flaws of humanity, as well as our hope for what can be.



A "Thank You" Letter to the Knitting Ministry



July 28, 2015

Dear Summit United Methodist Church:

I want to thank you for the beautiful hand-made blankets that you donated to my palliative care team. They are so special and I want you to know that they are treasured affirmations of God's love for those who receive them.

I had one woman recently who was terribly distraught over the news that she was not going to receive any more chemotherapy. She had been abounded by her family and she was feeling completely alone. When I tucked the blanket around her cold trembling body, I told her that every stitch in that blanket was a prayer assuring her that Jesus was going to walk with her, every step of this difficult journey. She absolutely loved it and every time I went in or went by her room, I saw the blanket, stretched out and covering her. She died with that blanket over her body, holding her, assuring her she was beloved.

Another time I was walking by our caregiver's center and saw a family member of a patient who was sitting alone, with a hospital blanket around her shoulders. I went and got one of your blankets and when I gave it to her she burst into tears. She told me she had been sitting there praying and asking God to send her a sign that somehow she was going to make it through this.

Sometimes when people donate things, they wonder where they are going, and if they are appreciated. I want you to know that your blankets are clearly filled with prayer and they are touching hearts here at Overlook Medical Center.

We are blessed to have a wonderful, committed, and spirit-filled group of **Sunday school teachers** returning to spend this year growing in service with our children and youth. 


