# From the Pastor

Lent is a season marked by intention, mystery, and possibility. For 40 days, we enter into a season of self-reflection, intentionally giving up something or perhaps taking on a spiritual practice in order to draw closer to God and reflect on where we are in our spiritual journeys. What this has translated into practice in my own life hasn't always looked, on the surface, much different than making a New Year's resolution.

Whether it was giving up chocolate or soda, the changes I made seemed like small things, and while I couldn't always articulate a deep reason for that change, it was rooted in a desire for something to be different. But somehow, engaged in the rhythms of church community—going to worship, participating in small groups, getting out and helping others in service—these little changes became so much more. Suddenly, my routine wasn't punctuated by the things I had given up, but by the things I was rediscovering about myself, about God, and about the ways in which God was moving in my life.

Our Lenten journeys are uniquely are own, and yet, as we journey this season together, we (re-)discover that we are loved and shepherded by a God of forgiveness and transformation. Such work is not always easy, and Lent will often take us to spaces where we not only become more aware of our shortcomings and brokenness, but confess that we want these pieces to be different. Fortunately, God does not leave us there, and over the course of 40 days as we journey towards the promise of Easter, God opens up possibilities for healing, renewed connection, joy, and transformation that we might not have realized were there.

How are you planning on journeying with God this Lent? As we enter into this season together, I hope that you will pair your individual practice with a renewed commitment to participating in our community life together. The pages of this newsletter are filled with a variety of opportunities in which to do so, and they range from worship to mission opportunities for all ages. God has something in store for you, for me, and for our church this Lenten season! Know that I am praying for you and for our church, and I look forward to hearing what possibilities God is revealing to you.


