# From Pastor Christina

#### Friends.

How is it with your soul? These are challenging times, and I pray each day for you and our community—that you are safe and feel God's presence close to you during these days. When we first made the decision to suspend in-person gatherings at the church, none of us could foresee how long this might last. I'm deeply grateful for your continued support, the ways in which you have adapted to gathering virtually, and how you are caring for each other and those in need in our community. You are good news to your loved ones and neighbors, and we are finding creative ways to be the church together even during a time of physical distancing!

I continue to find deep resonance between the Easter season and our present situation. In John's telling of the story, when Jesus appeared to Mary after the resurrection, she did not recognize him at first. It seems almost hard to imagine, given the time she and the other disciples spent with Jesus. But something about his experience and the resurrection changed his appearance just enough for Mary to have to look more closely. We know resurrection means new life, but this story challenges and invites us to see that a resurrected life does not always look like the life that came before. Mary experienced this with Jesus at the empty tomb, and as we begin to contemplate our new reality and the future ahead of us this year, this is true for us individually and as a church as well.

Although we do not yet know when we will gather again in our building, I am already thinking about what it might look like. It will be gradual, and we will continue to do what we can to ensure the health and well-being of all. Even as we continue to explore the specifics, in consultation with state guidelines and the guidance of the Greater New Jersey Annual Conference, what I do know is this. Already, we have adapted to new ways of being the church as we continue to live into our mission of making disciples for the transformation of the world. We are finding ways to care for our community and one another. Things will look different, and we will continue to adapt and do things in new ways, but the heart of our ministry and mission remain the same.

As we contemplate the things that have changed and what might be different moving forward, our new sermon series in May, "Unraveled," will focus on the ways God begins to weave the changes and our experiences into something new. For even though a resurrected life may look different, God's love and grace remain consistent.

Friends, we are still in the Easter season, and every day, we are Easter people. We are people who embrace hope and new life, who practice resurrection amidst the new changes it brings to our life. And we continue to trust that God is with us, that God will see us all through, and that God is doing a new and good thing for all people.

You don't need a Facebook account to watch! However, if you have an account, be sure to like and follow the church's page so you will receive a notification when the service goes live.




If you are unsure how to give in the absence of in-person worship services, there are a few options:
