From Pastor Christina

"God makes me lie down in green pastures; he leads me beside still waters; he restores my soul." — Psalm 23:2-3

We are living in extraordinary times. When 2020 began, we could not foresee what this year would bring. The COVID-19 pandemic has dramatically changed our lives, impacting us in a multitude of ways that will continue to unfold. On top of the coronavirus pandemic, our country is grappling anew with the pandemic of racism. All around us we are seeing renewed calls for justice and movements for social change. Navigating all that is going on, in the midst of ongoing change and ambiguity, calls forth much from us as we seek to not only love our neighbors, but transform the world so that it is better for all.

That is no small task, even in ordinary times! It's no wonder that as we enter into the summer, after months of loss and change, many of us may be finding ourselves tired, exhausted, or overwhelmed. How do we keep up? How do we stay connected to God? How do we find rest so that we can continue the faithful work to which God calls us?

Richard Rohr teaches that compassionate action must be balanced with contemplative practice. While there are many forms of contemplative practice, we see one model of this in Genesis, where after creating all that is, God rested in order to connect with all that had been created. As we go about our summers, engaging in our daily work of loving our neighbors, I invite you to carve out intentional times to rest in the way God rested. To not just slow down or catch up on some sleep—but to pause and enjoy the life you have, to revel in the beautiful gift of creation and the goodness and faithfulness of God that upholds it all. Sabbath and creation not only help us reconnect with God's original blessing, but reconnect with our work and world in meaningful ways.

Our worship will shift this summer to help us in this practice of sabbath renewal—read on to see what other opportunities there are to connect with each other and our greater community. Wherever your summer may take you, in all that you may do, I invite you to ponder this question: what is not just sustaining you, but giving you life?

May you find rest and renewal in the green pastures and still waters God leads you to this summer!

SUMMER WORSHIP UPDATES

Given the technology needs to set up the livestream and conference call on Sunday mornings, summer worship in July and August will remain at 10:30am.

Services will look and feel a little different as we create intentional time to worship, rest, and experience the gifts of God through sabbath and creation. CONTEMPLATIVE PHOTOGRAPHY VIRTUAL GROUP

It invites us to slow down, open ourselves to wonder, and discover God in new ways.

REOPENING UPDATE

Dear friends,

We hope this message finds you safe and well! It has been some time since we have been able to gather together in-person, and we are all looking forward to when we can gather together again. We have been hard at work over the past month working on a reopening plan for our worship and ministries, and as we move into the summer, we wanted to provide you with an update on where we are in our process.

We are closely following the <u>guidelines from the Greater New Jersey (GNJ) Annual Conference</u>, the State of NJ, and the CDC. In all of our conversations, safety for every member of our community is our guiding priority. We also recognize that any plan we make is contingent upon the continuing decrease of COVID-19 cases and hospitalizations in our area, and that it is subject to change based on the prevalence of the virus in New Jersey in the months to come.

GNJ is requiring that churches prepare a plan that addresses from when we arrive to the building to when we leave, while also addressing health and safety areas such as setting capacity limits on gathering size, maintaining 6 feet of social distancing, thorough cleaning processes for all surfaces and commonly used areas, signage, and protective measures such as masks and hand sanitizer.

We are working on a multi-stage plan that provides protocols for worship gatherings, staff & office use, small groups & committees, outside building use, and cleaning. We have so far put together draft protocols for worship and staff, and will be discussing the other areas in the next month. Once we have finished putting together a draft plan, we will seek input from GNJ to make sure we have not missed a critical piece of preparation, and then present the plan to Ad Council for approval.

What is becoming quickly apparent in our conversations is that when we reopen, things will look different in terms of how we gather and worship together. These changes, while not permanent, will be the new normal for us at least through the rest of this year. Worshipping in enclosed spaces poses some of the highest risk scenarios for virus transmission, and all of the guidance we are following urges us to take precautions seriously and adjust our worship life together so as to minimize as much risk as possible. These recommendations include shortening indoor services, limiting congregational singing and speaking, and implementing social distancing measures from when we arrive to when we leave.

We also recognize that many may not feel comfortable joining us for worship when we start regathering in-person; thus, we will continue to offer our livestream ministries to make sure that everybody has the opportunity to remain connected. Part of our work this summer is making sure our sanctuary is equipped to stream worship when we regather so everyone has the opportunity to worship.

At this point, we will continue to worship online for the rest of the summer, and it is not likely that we will gather for in-person worship until September. This timeframe is necessary not only to make sure we are fully prepared for in-person gatherings that accommodate everyone's safety, but to also prepare for meaningful ministry this fall across in-person and virtual gatherings.

These conversations are difficult as we try to balance spiritual, physical, social, and health needs. We acknowledge that there will be doubt and sadness about the modifications we need to make; we know many are eager to see one another again; but we also don't want to see anyone contract the virus through our worship services or ministries. What gives us hope in our conversations is the willingness and resiliency of our congregation over the past three months as we have adapted to the changes brought by the pandemic. Truly, our church never closed, for we have continued to be the church in our homes and communities.


VIRTUAL OFFICE HOURS
