## From Pastor Christina

When I start driving, before I even back out of the driveway, I usually program my destination into my GPS. Even if I know where I'm going, I like that it tells me about upcoming turns or potential delays that will impact my trip. It's not uncommon for my husband, on the other hand, to get into the car, start driving, and then a few minutes later turn to me and say, "Wait a minute...where are we going?" We can all get into a car and start driving, but knowing where you are going helps provide a sense of direction!

The same is true for our own lives and our common life together as a community of faith. We trust that God calls us and guides our steps as we live out our faith, but reflecting on our why--or our purpose and values--helps us move forward with intention and can encourage us in hard times.

This month in worship, we'll begin a new sermon series called "Focus" that invites us to reflect on our individual whys and our why as a congregation, so we can discern how God is calling us in this season to love our neighbors, ourselves, and God.

Take time to reflect on your personal "why," as well as our congregation's "why," using these questions:

- What is your purpose?
- · What do you value?
- What are the reasons behind what you do?
- How do your answers reflect the UMC mission statement ("to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world"), and what connections do you notice?

Try turning your notes into a messy first draft of your why statement, and share it with me so that I can share them with our church leadership at the next Ad Council meeting in November.

You are loved, friends! I hope you feel that love and see and feel fresh reminders of God's love for you this month!

- Extend the spirit of fellowship by engaging in the comments during the service and/or by reaching out to other members of the congregation afterwards. Hospitality happens not because we are in the same place, but because of how we reach out to one another!


#### MAKE YOUR PLAN TO VOTE
