Paintner's book of the same title,




Join us on Palm Sunday as our children participate in our annual If your child would like to participate in the Palm parade, please arrive at 10:15am.


#### Came to Believe: A Growing Service of Hope and Healing

- Every plant in the program serves a purpose: providing critical habitat and food sources for pollinators. While our Plant – Pollinator Interactions highlights many of these beneficial relationships, the truth is, the connections between native plants, wildlife, and pollinators are virtually endless.
- Plant Sale Closes: April 18 at 5:00 PM
- Order Pickup: Order pickup in on May 3, with plants distributed locally to your chosen partner-operated pickup location. At checkout, you'll need to select one of 14 local sites to finalize your order. Please note that your selection cannot

be changed after submission. Explore our 2025 Pickup Locations, available through our trusted 2025 Plant Sale Partners, and plan ahead! (Locations subject to change.)

On May 3rd you can pick up your plant and bring it to the church. The Green Team will assist if you are not able to pick up your plant.

On Sunday, May 18th, following worship we will plant our pollinators in our new garden. The event will be accompanied by an outdoor coffee featuring treats made with honey! And there's more. . .

The children will be raising Painted Lady butterflies, which will be released in our new garden.




essential items to local families in need. This simple yet meaningful act of love brought joy to children and families, reminding them of the hope and renewal that Easter represents.

# Youth-Mission Food Drive Reaches Goal, Supports Food Insecure Families

Our community came together in a powerful way, and we are thrilled to announce that we successfully reached our goal of collecting 109 food items to support those experiencing food insecurity!

The youth not only had fun collecting and sorting but they also started to learn and raise awareness of food insecurity. Some of the youth were surprised to learn that approximately 10.7% of New Jersey's population, equating to about 994,800 individuals—including 262,260 children—experience food insecurity. About 38,470 of these people live in our county.

As they organized the food drive, our young volunteers engaged in meaningful discussions about food insecurity, exploring its causes and impact on families in our community. They discovered that food insecurity is not just about having enough food but also about access, affordability, and systemic challenges that make it difficult for many to meet their basic needs.

Through their efforts, they not only reached their collection goal but also deepened their commitment to ongoing service and advocacy. This experience has sparked conversations about what more can be done to address hunger in our area. We will continue to explore this theme and think about future initiatives to keep the momentum going.

A heartfelt thank you to everyone who contributed—whether by donating, volunteering, or spreading the word.




