Dear UMC Summit Members and Friends,

Fall is always a season of new beginnings—when the air turns crisp, the leaves remind us that change is part of God's beautiful design, and our church family steps boldly into new ministries and renewed purpose. This year, we are embracing the words of Isaiah 43:19: "See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it?" God is surely at

work among us, and our congregation is blossoming with opportunities to grow in faith, serve our community, and walk alongside one another in love and grace.

NEW! Mental Health Ministry

There are so many exciting new ministries and opportunities to grow in faith here at our church.

I am especially grateful to share the development of our new **Mental Health Ministry**, led by long-time member and candidate for ordained ministry, Dr. Alison Johsnon. The new Mental Health Ministry program seeks to bring hope and healing to our community through addressing the mental health challenges so many are facing today through the lens of faith. This ministry will include:

- * A **Social Skills Group** for children ages 8–12, helping young people build healthy relationships and confidence.
- * Two **Lifeline Workshops** open to the wider community, addressing pressing issues facing youth and their families.
- * Our **Came to Believe** worship service designed with the recovery community in mind, but welcoming to all.
- * And, beginning in January 2026, a **support group for individuals and caregivers of aging parents**, offering care, prayer, and practical resources.

These ministries remind us that the church is not only a place of worship, but a sanctuary of support and compassion.

Children, Youth, and Families Ministry

Our **Children**, **Youth**, **and Families Ministry** program, led by Drew seminarian Carrie-Lee Farnham, is thriving with renewed energy this season. We are launching a new **Confirmation Class** cohort, helping young people claim their faith and become full participants in the life of the church. Our **Sunday School** room has been refreshed with new arrangements and resources to create a welcoming, engaging environment for learning. Families can look forward to exciting new events throughout the year, and our **Youth Group** is preparing for a robust calendar of activities that nurture friendships and deepen discipleship.

Senior Affordable Housing Project



Fall Kickoff! Next Sunday, September 14th - Starting at 10:30AM Worship, Picnic, and PETTING ZOO!



NEW! Mental Health Ministry



The Mental Health Ministry at Summit United Methodist Church was born out of a growing awareness that our community is struggling with rising levels of anxiety, depression, addiction, and loneliness. We recognized that many people feel disconnected, fearful about the future, and unsure where to turn for support. The church

wanted to respond to these needs faithfully and compassionately, creating a space where people could find healing, connection, and hope. Our mission is rooted in the conviction that mental, emotional, and spiritual well-being are essential to the abundant life God desires for all people. At its heart, the ministry is committed to inclusion, belonging, compassion, and practical support—meeting people where they are and walking with them in community.

The ministry now offers a variety of programs: Came to Believe, a monthly worship service designed especially for people in recovery; a Social Skills Group for children to learn and practice healthy ways of relating; the Life Line Workshop Series, which provides practical tools and conversations for families navigating life's challenges; and a Support Group for Caregivers of Aging Parents, offering encouragement and guidance for those carrying the weight of care (scheduled to start in January 2026). These programs reflect our vision to be a church where mental health is not a stigma but a shared commitment, and where every person is valued and supported. Looking ahead, we see this ministry expanding into a broader Wellness Mission—a place that integrates faith, mental health, and community life in ways that can powerfully transform the lives of those around us.


I am Dr. Alison Johnson, a licensed psychologist and Mental Health Minister at Summit UMC. For over 33 years I have directed Summit Psychological Services, where I specialize in working with children, teens, and young people, as well as with individuals and families struggling with addictive behaviors. This calling—integrating professional expertise with the compassion of faith—has shaped my life's work. I feel deeply excited about bringing these gifts into the church setting, helping to create a ministry that honors the wholeness of body, mind, and spirit. I believe God has prepared us for this moment, and I am humbled and energized to lead a ministry that can make such a profound difference in people's lives.






